REGULATION OF THE CITY OF PROBOLINGGO
NUMBER 4 OF 2023
ON
REGIONAL TAXES AND RETRIBUTIONS

BY THE BLESSING OF THE ALMIGHTY GOD

MAYOR OF PROBOLINGGO,

- Considering :
- a. that regional taxes and regional retributions are the instruments for achieving people’s welfare and regional independence as part of the implementation of regional autonomy;
 - b. that in accordance with Article 286 section (1) of Law Number 23 of 2014 on Regional Government, it is stated that Regional Taxes and Regional Retributions are enacted by a law of which its implementation in the Region is further regulated by Regional Regulations;
 - c. that the receipt of regional taxes and regional levies shall increase regional revenue which is oriented towards optimal public service implementation;
 - d. that regulations related to taxation and retributions in the regions are no longer in accordance with the developments in national law and policy, and as an implementation of the provisions of Article 94 of Law Number 1 of 2022 on Financial Relations Between the Central Government and Regional Governments, it is necessary to establish actual, comprehensive, and effective regulations on taxes and retributions, with the aim of providing a legal basis and certainty, as well as a form of simplification of regional regulations;
 - e. that in order to implement the provisions of Government Regulation Number 35 of 2023 on General Provisions for Regional Taxes and Retributions, all provisions for Regional Taxes and Retributions are

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enacted in one Regional Regulation which is the basis for collecting taxes and retribution in the Region;

- f. that based on the considerations as referred to in point a, b, c, d and e, it is necessary to establish Regional Regulation on Regional Taxes and Retributions.

To issue : REGIONAL REGULATION ON REGIONAL TAXES AND RETRIBUTIONS.

CHAPTER I
GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

In this Regulation:

1. Region means Probolinggo City.
2. Local Government means Local Government of Probolinggo City.
3. Mayor means the Mayor of Probolinggo.
4. Regional Working Unit means the supporting units for the Mayor and the Regional House of Representatives in administering Government Affairs which falls under the authority of the Region.
5. Regional Tax, hereinafter referred to as Tax, means a mandatory contribution to the Region which is taxable by an individual that is coercive in nature based on the Law, by not receiving direct compensation and being used for Regional needs for the greatest prosperity of the people.
6. Regional Retribution, hereinafter referred to as Retribution, means a local retribution as payment for certain services or permits which are specifically provided and/or granted by the Local Government for the benefit of individuals or entities.
7. Taxable Subject means individuals or entities that may be a subject to Tax.
8. Taxpayers are individuals or entities, including taxable subject, tax withholding agents and tax collectors, who have tax rights and obligations in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations.

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9. Subject of Retribution means individuals or entities that use goods, services and/or permits.
10. Retribution Obligors means individuals or agencies who according to laws and regulations are required to pay retribution, including certain retribution collectors.
11. Agency means a group of people and/or capital which constitutes a unit, whether conducting business or not conducting business, including limited liability companies, limited partnership companies, other companies, state-owned enterprises, regional-owned enterprises, or village-owned enterprises, with the name and in any form, firm, joint venture, cooperative, pension fund, alliances, association, foundation, mass organization, socio-political organization, or any other organization, institution and other form of entity, including collective investment contracts and permanent establishments.
12. Motor Vehicle Tax (Pajak Kendaraan Bermotor), hereinafter abbreviated to as PKB, means tax on ownership and/or control of motor vehicles.
13. Motor Vehicle Duty (Bea Balik Nama Kendaraan Bermotor), hereinafter abbreviated to as BBNKB, means a Tax on a supply of the ownership rights of a motor vehicle as a result of an agreement between two parties or a unilateral measures or circumstances occurring due to a purchase and sale, exchange, grants, inheritance, or admission into a business entity.
14. Motor Vehicle means all wheeled vehicles and their trailers used on all types of land roads or vehicles operated on water which are driven by technical equipment in the form of motors or other equipment whose function is to convert a certain energy resource into the motor power of the motor vehicle concerned.
15. Heavy Equipment Tax (Pajak Alat Berat), hereinafter abbreviated as PAB, means tax on ownership and/or control of heavy equipment.
16. Heavy Equipment means a tool/equipment created to assist construction work and other civil engineering work which is heavy in nature when carried out by human power, operates using a motor with or without wheels, not permanently attached and operates in certain areas, including but not limited to construction areas, plantations, forestry and mining.
17. Land and Building Tax of Rural and Urban areas (Pajak Bumi dan Bangunan Pedesaan dan Perkotaan), hereinafter abbreviated as PBB-P2, means tax on land and/or buildings owned, controlled and/or utilized by individuals or entities.
18. Earth means the surface of the earth which includes land and inland waters.
19. Building means engineering constructions that are planted or attached permanently above the Earth's surface and below the Earth's surface.
20. Acquisition Duty of Right on Land and Building (Bea Perolehan Hak atas Tanah dan Bangunan), hereinafter abbreviated to as BPHTB, means a tax on the acquisition of land and/or building rights.

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21. Motor Vehicle Fuel Tax (Pajak Bahan Bakar Kendaraan Bermotor), hereinafter abbreviated as PBBKB, means a tax on the use of motor vehicle fuel and heavy equipment.
22. Certain Goods and Services Tax (Pajak Barang dan Jasa Tertentu), hereinafter abbreviated as PBJT, means a tax paid by final consumers for the consumption of certain goods and/or services.
23. Advertisement Tax means a tax on carrying out advertisements.
24. Surface Water Tax (Pajak Air Permukaan), hereinafter abbreviated to as PAP, means a tax on the extraction and/or utilization of surface water.
25. Cigarette Tax means a tax on cigarette excise collected by the Government.
26. Groundwater Tax (Pajak Air Tanah), hereinafter abbreviated as PAT, means a tax on the extraction and/or utilization of groundwater.
27. Non-Metal Minerals and Rocks Tax (Pajak Mineral Bukan Logam dan Batuan), hereinafter referred to as MBLB Tax, means a tax on the activity of extracting non-metallic minerals and rocks from natural sources within and/or on the surface of the earth for use.
28. Non-Metal Minerals and Rocks (Mineral Bukan Logam dan Batuan), hereinafter abbreviated to as MBLB, means non-metallic minerals and rocks as intended in the laws and regulations in the mineral and coal sector.
29. Swallow's Nest Tax means a tax on the collection and/or exploitation of swallow's nests.
30. Piggyback tax (*Opsen*) means an additional tax imposed based on certain percentage.
31. Piggyback Tax for Motor Vehicle, hereinafter referred to as Opsen PKB, means the Piggiback Tax imposed by regions/cities on PKB's principal tax in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.
32. Piggyback Tax for Motor Vehicle Duty, hereinafter referred to as Opsen BBNKB, means the Piggiback Tax imposed by regions/cities on BBNKB's principal tax in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.
33. Piggyback Tax for Non-Metal Minerals and Rocks, hereinafter referred to as Opsen MBLB, means the Piggiback Tax imposed by provinces on MBLB's principal tax in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.
34. Regional Tax Object Registration Number (Nomor Objek Pajak Daerah), hereinafter abbreviated to as NOPD, means a regional tax object identification number as a means of tax administration with certain provisions
35. Sales Value of Taxable Object (Nilai Jual Objek Pajak), hereinafter abbreviated to as NJOP, means the average price of buying-and-selling transactions that occur naturally, and if there is no sale and purchase transaction, NJOP is determined by comparing prices with other similar objects, or new acquisition value, or NJOP replacement.

36. Collection means a series of activities starting from collecting data on Taxable objects and subjects, determining the amount of Tax payable to Tax Collection activities from Taxpayers and monitoring the payment.
37. Tax Return on Regional Tax (Surat Pemberitahuan Pajak Daerah), hereinafter abbreviated to as SPTPD, means a form that Taxpayers use to report the calculation and/or payment of Tax, Taxable objects and/or non-Taxable objects, and/or assets and liabilities in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations of Regional Tax.
38. Notice of Regional Tax Assessment (Surat Ketetapan Pajak Daerah), hereinafter abbreviated to as SKPD, means a Notice of Tax Assessment that determines the amount of main amount of Tax payable.
39. Regional Tax Payment Slip (Surat Setoran Pajak Daerah), hereinafter abbreviated to as SSPD, means proof of payment or deposit for Tax that has been made using a form or has been made by other means to the Regional Treasury through a payment place appointed by the Mayor.
40. Payable Tax Return (Surat Pemberitahuan Pajak Terutang), hereinafter abbreviated to as SPPT, means a form used to notify the amount of payable PBB-P2 to the Taxpayer.
41. Notice of Regional Tax Underpayment Assessment (Surat Ketetapan Pajak Daerah Kurang Bayar), hereinafter abbreviated to as SKPDKB means a Tax assessment form which determines the amount of the principal amount of Tax, the amount of Tax credits, the amount of the underpayment in principal Tax payments, the amount of administrative sanctions, and the amount of Tax that shall be paid.
42. Notice of Regional Tax Collection (Surat Tagihan Pajak Daerah) hereinafter abbreviated to as STPD means a form to conduct tax collections and/or administrative sanctions in the form of interest and/or fines
43. Decree Correction (Surat Keputusan Pembetulan) means a decree that corrects written errors, calculation errors, and/or errors in the application of certain provisions in Regional tax laws and regulations contained in the Payable Tax Return, Notice of Regional Tax Assessment, Notice of Regional Tax Underpayment Assessment, Notice of Additional Tax Regional Underpayment Assessment, Notice of Nil Regional Tax Assessment, Notice of Regional Overpayment Assessment, Notice of Regional Tax Collection, Decree Correction, or Decree Objection.
44. Decree Objection means a decree on objection towards Payable Tax Return, Notice of Regional Tax Assessment, Notice of Regional Tax Underpayment Assessment, Notice of Additional Tax Regional Underpayment Assessment, Notice of Nil Regional Tax Assessment, Notice of Regional Overpayment Assessment, Notice of Regional Tax Collection, Decree Correction, or towards third-party deduction or collection submitted by Taxpayers.

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45. Decision on Appeal means decision made by Tax Court on the appeal against Decree Objection submitted by Taxpayers.
46. Tax Collection with Warrant means a series of actions conducted with effort of reprimanding or warning, carrying out Collection immediately and simultaneously, notifying Distress Warrant, proposing for prevention, carrying out confiscation, carrying out hostage-taking, selling goods that have been confiscated, to force Taxpayers pay off Tax debts and Tax Collection costs.
47. Tax Liability means Tax that still has to be paid including administrative sanctions in the form of interest, fines or increases, as is stated in the SKPD or other notices on regional tax laws and regulations.
48. Reprimand Letter means a letter issued by an Official to reprimand taxpayers or retribution obligors to pay off tax liability or retribution liability.
49. Distress warrant means a letter of warrant to pay off Tax Liability and costs of Tax Collection with Warrant.
50. Bailiff of Tax means those who carry out tax collection actions which include immediate and simultaneous collection, notification of Distress Warrant, confiscation and hostage-taking.
51. Audit means a series of activities to collect and process data, information and/or evidence which is carried out objectively and professionally based on an audit standard to test compliance with taxes and regional retribution obligations and/or for other purposes in order to implement the provisions of regional tax laws and regulations.
52. Taxable Period means a period of time that is the basis for Taxpayers to calculate, deposit and report tax payable within a certain period as is specified in this Law.
53. Taxable Year means a period of 1 (one) calendar year, unless the Taxpayer uses a different financial year with the calendar year.
54. Public Services means services provided or delivered by the Regional Government for the purposes of public interest and benefit and may be enjoyed by individuals or entities.
55. Business Services means services provided or delivered by the Regional Government which may be for profit as it may be basically provided by the private sector.
56. Certain Permits means certain activities of the Regional Government in the context of granting permits to individuals or entities which are intended for the guidance, regulation, control and supervision of activities, use of space, and use of natural resources, goods, infrastructure, facilities or certain facilities in order to protect the public interest. and maintain environmental sustainability.
57. Notice of Regional Tax Assessment, hereinafter abbreviated to as SKRD, means a notice of retribution assessment that determines the principal amount of the retribution payable.
58. Regional Public Service Agency, hereinafter abbreviated to as BLUD, means a system implemented by regional working units or sub-regional work units in regional work units in providing services to the people that have flexibility in financial management

patterns as an exception to the regional financial management provisions in generally.

CHAPTER II
SCOPE
Article 2

The scope of this Regional Regulation include:

- a. Regional Tax;
- b. Regional Retribution;
- c. Collection of Tax and Retribution;
- d. Deduction, Relief, Exemption, Elimination or Postponement of Payment of Principal Taxes, Principal Retributions, and/or Sanctions;
- e. Providing Tax and Retribution Facilities;
- f. Confidentiality of Taxpayer Data; dan
- g. Provisions of Criminal Acts.

CHAPTER III
REGIONAL TAX
Part One
Type of Taxes
Article 3

- (1) Type of Taxes:
 - a. PBB-P2;
 - b. BPHTB;
 - c. PBJT on:
 - 1. Food and / or Beverages;
 - 2. Electricity;
 - 3. Hospitality Services;
 - 4. Parking Services; and
 - 5. Arts and Entertainment Services.
 - d. Advertisement Tax;
 - e. PAT;
 - f. MBLB Tax;
 - g. Swallow's Nest Tax;
 - h. Opsen PKB; and
 - i. Opsen BBNKB.
- (2) Type of taxes as referred to in section (1) point a, point b, point c, point d, point e, point h, and point i are collected by the Region.
- (3) Type of taxes as referred to in section (1) point f, and point g, are not collected by the Region.

Article 4

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- (1) The types of taxes as referred to in Article 3 section (2) which are collected based on the enactment of the Mayor include:
 - a. PBB-P2;
 - b. Advertisement Tax;
 - c. PAT;
 - d. Opsen PKB; and
 - e. Opsen BBNKB.
- (2) The types of Tax as referred to in Article 3 section (2) which are collected based on the Taxpayer's own calculations include:
 - a. BPHTB;
 - b. PBJT on:
 1. Food and / or Beverages;
 2. Electricity;
 3. Hotel Services;
 4. Parking Services; and
 5. Art and Entertainment Services.

Part Two
Tax Details
Paragraph 1
PBB-P2
Article 5

- (1) The objects of PBB-P2 are land and/or buildings owned, controlled, and/or utilized by individuals or entities, except for areas used for plantation, forestry and mining business activities.
- (2) Land as referred to in section (1) includes the surface of the Earth resulting from reclamation or backfilling activities.
- (3) What are excluded from PBB-P2 objects as referred to in section (1) include ownership, control and/or utilization of:
 - a. Land and/or buildings of government offices, regional government offices and other state administration offices which are administered as state property or regional property;
 - b. Land and/or buildings used solely to serve public interests in the fields of religion, social care, health, education and national culture, which are not intended to make a profit;
 - c. Land and/or buildings that are solely used for graves, ancient relics, or similar ones;

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- d. Land which is protected forest, nature reserve forest, tourist forest, national park, grazing land controlled by villages, and state land that is not yet encumbered with rights;
- e. Land and/or buildings used by diplomatic representatives and consulates based on the principle of reciprocal treatment;
- f. Land and/or buildings used by bodies or representatives of international institutions enacted by ministerial regulations that carry out government affairs in the field of state finance;
- g. Land and/or Buildings for railway lines, integrated highways (Mass Rapid Transit), integrated highways (Light Rail Transit), or similar ones;
- h. Land and/or other residential buildings based on certain NJOP enacted by the Mayor; and
- i. Land and/or buildings that are being subject to land and building tax by the Government.

Article 6

- (1) PBB-P2 Tax Subjects are individuals or entities that actually have rights to land and/or obtain benefits from land, and/or own, control, and/or obtain benefits from buildings.
- (2) PBB-P2 Taxpayers are individuals or entities who actually have rights to land and/or obtain benefits from land, and/or own, control, and/or obtain benefits from buildings.

Article 7

- (1) The basis for the imposition of PBB-P2 is NJOP.
- (2) NJOP as referred to in section (1) is determined based on the PBB-P2 assessment process.
- (3) Non-taxable NJOP is set at IDR 10,000,000.00 (ten million rupiah) for each Taxpayer.
- (4) In the event that a Taxpayer owns or controls more than one PBB-P2 object in the Region, then the non-taxable NJOP as referred to in section (3) is only given for one PBB-P2 object for each Tax Year.
- (5) NJOP as referred to in section (1) is determined every 3 (three) years, except for certain tax objects which can be determined every year in accordance with regional developments.
- (6) The amount of NJOP is enacted by Mayor Decree.
- (7) Further provisions on the PBB-P2 assessment as referred to in section (2) are regulated in a Mayor Regulation which is guided by the ministerial regulations that

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carry out government affairs in the field of state finance regarding PBBP2 assessment.

Article 8

- (1) The basis for imposition of PBB-P2 as referred to in Article 7 section (1) is set at a minimum of 20% (twenty percent) and a maximum of 100% (one hundred percent) of NJOP after deducting non-taxable NJOP as referred to in Article 7 section (3).
- (2) The percentage of NJOP as referred to in section (1) for the PBB-P2 object group is determined by considering:
 - a. increase in NJOP as a result of the assessment;
 - b. form of utilization of Tax Objects; and/or
 - c. NJOP clustering in a Region.
- (3) Further provisions on the percentage amount as referred to in section (1) and considerations as referred to in section (2) are regulated in the Mayor Regulation.

Article 9

- (1) PBB-P2 rate is set at 0.2% (zero point two percent).
- (2) The PBB-P2 rate as referred to in section (1) which is production land of food and livestock is set at 0.1% (zero point one percent).

Article 10

The principal amount of PBB-P2 payable is calculated by multiplying the basis imposition for PBB-P2 as referred to in Article 8 section (1) by the PBB-P2 rate as referred to in Article 9.

Article 11

- (1) The amount of PBB-P2 payable is determined at the time of ownership, control and/or utilization of the Land and/or Building.
- (2) The determining time for calculating the outstanding PBB-P2 as referred to in section (1) is based on the condition of the PBB-P2 object on January 1.

Article 12

- (1) The Collection Area of the PBB-P2 payable is the Regional area which includes the location of the PBB-P2 object.
- (2) The PBB-P2 Collection area as referred to in section (1) is the Regional area where the following Land and/or Buildings are located:
 - a. inland seas and land waters and buildings thereon, and
 - b. Buildings located outside the inland sea and inland waters of which technical construction is connected to buildings located on land, except for submarine pipes and cables.

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Paragraph 2

Acquisition Duty of Right on Land and Building (BPHTB)

Article 13

- (1) The object of BPHTB is the acquisition of rights to land and/or buildings.
- (2) Acquisition of Land and/or Building Rights as referred to in section (1) includes:
 - a. transfer of rights due to:
 1. buying and selling;
 2. exchange;
 3. grants;
 4. testamentary grant;
 5. inheritance;
 6. income in companies or other legal entities;
 7. separation of rights resulting in transfer;
 8. appointment of buyers in the auction;
 9. implementation of the judge's decision which has permanent legal force;
 10. business merger;
 11. business consolidation;
 12. business expansion; or
 13. gift; and
 - b. granting new rights due to:
 1. continued release of rights; or
 2. excluded from the waiver of rights.
- (3) Rights to Land and/or Buildings as referred to in section (1) include:
 - a. right of ownership;
 - b. Cultivation Rights;
 - c. building rights;
 - d. use rights;
 - e. ownership rights to apartment units; and
 - f. management rights.
- (4) Objects being excluded from BPHTB are the Acquisition of Rights to Land and/or Buildings:
 - a. for Government offices, Regional Government, state administrators and other state institutions which are recorded as state property or Regional property;
 - b. by the state for the administration of government and/or for the implementation of development in the public interest;
 - c. or international bodies or representatives of institutions on condition that they do not carry out business or carry out other activities outside the functions and duties of the body or representative of institutions;
 - d. for diplomatic representatives and consulates based on the principle of reciprocal treatment;

- e. by an individual or entity due to conversion of rights or due to other legal acts without a change in name;
- f. by an individual or entity due to waqf;
- g. by individuals or entities used for religious purposes; and
- h. for low-income communities in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

Article 14

- (1) Taxable Subjects of BPHTB are individuals or Entities who obtain Rights to Land and/or Buildings.
- (2) BPHTB Taxpayers are individuals or Entities who obtain Rights to Land and/or Buildings.

Article 15

- (1) The basis for imposition of BPHTB is the acquisition value of the tax object as regulated in the laws and regulations governing Taxes and Retributions.
- (2) The acquisition value of the tax object as referred to in section (1) is determined as follows:
 - a. transaction price for buying and selling;
 - b. market value for exchange, gifts, wills, inheritance, income in companies or other legal entities, separation of rights which results in transfer, transfer of rights due to the implementation of a judge's decision which has permanent legal force, granting new rights to land as a continuation of the release of rights, granting new rights to land apart from relinquishment of rights, business mergers, business consolidation, business expansion, and gifts; and
 - c. transaction price stated in the auction minutes for the appointment of buyers in the auction.
- (3) In the event that the acquisition value of the tax object as referred to in section (2) is unknown or is lower than the NJOP used in the imposition of land and building tax in the year of acquisition, the basis for the BPHTB imposition used is the NJOP used in the imposition of land and building tax building in the year of acquisition.
- (4) The amount of acquisition value of non-taxable objects is set at IDR 80,000,000.00 (eighty million rupiah) for the acquisition of the Taxpayer's first right in the Regional area where the BPHTB is payable.
- (5) In the event of the acquisition of rights due to a will or inheritance grant as referred to in Article 13 section (2) point a number 4 and number 5 received by an individual who is still in a blood relationship in a straight line of descent one degree up or one degree down. Under the grantor's will or heir, including husband/wife, the value of the acquisition of non-taxable objects is set at IDR 300,000,000.00 (three hundred million rupiah).
- (6) In the event that the acquisition of rights due to a gift or will or inheritance as referred to in section (6) will be used for public purposes, education, a place of

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worship, or used solely for non-profit purposes, the value of the acquisition of the non-taxable tax object is determined at the amount IDR 600,000,000.00 (six hundred million rupiah).

Article 16

BPHTB rate is set at 5% (five percent).

Article 17

The principal amount of BPHTB payable is calculated by multiplying the basis for imposition of BPHTB as referred to in Article 15 section (1) after deducting the acquisition value of non-taxable objects as referred to in Article 15 section (4) or section (5) or section (6), with BPHTB rates as referred to in Article 16.

Article 18

- (1) BPHTB is set to be payable whereby the land and/or building is acquired with the following provisions:
- a. on the date the binding sale and purchase agreement for sale and purchase is made and signed;
 - b. on the date the deed is drawn up and signed for exchange, gift, bequest, income of a company or other legal entities, separation of rights resulting in transfer, business merger, business consolidation, business expansion, and/or gift;
 - c. on the date the beneficiary or the person authorized by the beneficiary registers the transfer of their rights to the land office for inheritance;
 - d. on the date of the court decision which has permanent legal force for the judge's decision;
 - e. on the date of issuance of the decree of granting rights to grant new rights to land as a continuance of the release of rights;
 - f. on the date of issuance of the decree of granting rights to grant a new rights other than the release of rights; and
 - g. on the date of appointment of the winning bidder for the auction.
- (2) In the event that the sale and purchase of land and/or buildings does not use a binding sale and purchase agreement as referred to in section (1) point a, BPHTB for the sale and purchase is set to be payable whereby the sale and purchase deed is signed.

Article 19

The BPHTB collection area that is payable is the regional area where the land and/or building is located.

Paragraph 3

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PBJT
Article 20

The object of PBJT is the sale, delivery and/or consumption of certain goods and services which include:

- a. Food and / or Beverages;
- b. Electricity;
- c. Hotel Services;
- d. Parking Services; and
- e. Art and Entertainment Services.

Article 21

- (1) Sales and/or delivery of Food and/or Beverages as referred to in Article 20 point a includes Food and/or Beverages provided by:
 - a. Restaurants that provide at least food and/or beverages serving facilities in the form of tables, chairs, and/or eating and drinking equipment;
 - b. catering service providers who carry out:
 - 1. the process of providing raw materials and semi-finished materials, making, storing and serving based on orders;
 - 2. presentation at the location desired by the customer and is different from the location where the making and storage processes are carried out; and
 - 3. presentation which is carried out with or without equipment and staff.
- (2) Objects as referred to in section (1) that are being excluded from PBJT are the delivery of food and beverages:
 - a. with business turnover not exceeding IDR 7,500,000.00 (seven million and five hundred thousand rupiah) per month;
 - b. carried out by supermarkets and the similar ones which do not solely sell Food and/or Beverages;
 - c. carried out by Food and/or Beverage factories; or
 - d. provided by a facility provider whose main business activity is providing lounge services at the airport.

Article 22

- (1) Electricity Consumption as referred to in Article 20 point b is the use of Electricity by final consumers.
- (2) The following are being excluded from electricity consumption as referred to in section (1):
 - a. electricity consumption by Government agencies, Regional Governments and other state administrators;

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- b. electricity consumption in the places used by embassies, consulates and foreign country representatives based on the principle of reciprocity;
- c. electricity consumption at worship places, old age homes, orphanages, and other similar social institutions; and
- d. consumption of self-generated Electricity with a certain capacity that does not require permission from the related technical agency.

Article 23

- (1) Hotel services as referred to in Article 20 point c involves services of providing accomodation and supporting facilities, and meeting rooms at the hotel service providers including:
 - a. hotel;
 - b. hostel;
 - c. villa;
 - d. cottage;
 - e. motel;
 - f. inn;
 - g. tourism guest house;
 - h. guest house;
 - i. lodging house/guesthouse/bungalow/resort/cottage;
 - j. private residences that is used as hotels; dan
 - k. glamping (glamour camping).
- (2) The following are being excluded from Hotel services as referred to in section (1):
 - a. dormitory housing services provided by the Government or Regional Government;
 - b. housing facility services at hospitals, nurse dormitory, old age homes, orphanages, and other similar social institutions;
 - c. housing facility services at education center or religious activities;
 - d. travel agency or tour services; and
 - e. room rental services for business in hotels.

Article 24

- (1) Parking Services as referred to in Article 20 point d:
 - a. provision of parking area;
 - b. pelayanan memarkirkan kendaraan (parkir *valet*).
- (2) The following are being excluded from the parking services referred to in section (1):
 - a. parking services provided by the Government and Regional Government;
 - b. parking services provided by offices that have been used only for the employees; and

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- c. parking services provided by embassies, jasa tempat parkir yang diselenggarakan oleh kedutaan, consulates, and representatives of foreign countries on the principle of reciprocity.

Article 25

- (1) Arts and Entertainment as referred to in Article 20 point e involve:
 - a. watching films or other forms of audio-visual spectacles shown live at a certain location;
 - b. art, music, dance and/or fashion performances;
 - c. beauty contest;
 - d. bodybuilding contests;
 - e. exhibition;
 - f. circus, acrobatics, and magic shows;
 - g. horse racing and motor vehicle competitions;
 - h. dexterity games;
 - i. sports games using places/spaces and/or equipment and supplies for sports and fitness;
 - j. recreational water rides, ecological rides, educational rides, cultural rides, snow rides, game rides, fishing, agrotourism and zoos;
 - k. reflexology; and
 - l. steam bath/spa.
- (2) What being excluded from Arts and Entertainment Services as referred to in section (1) are Arts and Entertainment Services that have a main purpose to:
 - a. promote the traditional culture for free; and/or
 - b. free community service activities.

Article 26

- (1) Subject of PBJT are the consumers of certain goods and services.
- (2) PBJT Taxpayers are individuals or entities that sell, deliver and/or consume certain goods and services.

Article 27

- (1) The basis imposition of PBJT is the amount paid by consumers of certain goods or services, including:
 - a. the amount of payment received by the Food and/or Beverage provider for PBJT for Food and/or Beverages;
 - b. selling value of Electric Power for PBJT for Electric Power;
 - c. amount of payment to Hospitality Service providers for PBJT for Hospitality Services;
 - d. the amount of payment to the parking lot provider or operator and/or vehicle parking service provider for PBJT for Parking Services; and

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- e. the amount of payment received by the Arts and Entertainment Services organizer for PBJT for Arts and Entertainment Services.
- (2) In the event that the payment as referred to in section (1) uses a voucher or other similar form containing the value of the rupiah or other currency, the basis for imposition of PBJT is determined at the value of the rupiah or other currency.
- (3) In the event that there is no payment as referred to in section (1), the basis for imposition of PBJT is calculated based on the selling price of similar goods and services applicable in the relevant regional area.
- (4) In the event that the Regional Government determines a policy to control the use of private vehicles and the level of congestion, specifically for PBJT for Parking Services as referred to in section (1) point d, the Regional Government can determine the basis for charging the parking rate before any deductions are imposed.

Article 28

- (1) The selling value of electricity as referred to in Article 27 section (1) point b is determined for:
 - a. electrical Power originating from other sources with payment; and
 - b. Self-generated electric power.
- (2) The selling value of Electric Power determined for Electric Power originating from other sources with payment as referred to in section (1) point a, is calculated based on:
 - a. the amount of fixed charges/charges plus the kWh/variable usage charges billed in the electricity bill, for postpaid; and
 - b. the amount of Electricity purchase, for prepayment.
- (3) The selling value of Electric Power determined for self-generated Electric Power as referred to in section (1) point b is calculated based on:
 - a. available capacity;
 - b. level of electricity usage;
 - c. period of electricity usage; and
 - d. the electricity unit price applicable in the Regional area.
- (4) The selling value of Electric Power determined for Electric Power originating from other sources with payment as referred to in section (1) point a and the provisions as referred to in section (2), the Electric Power provider as Taxpayer shall calculate and collect PBJT on Electrical Power for the use of Electrical Power that is sold or delivered.

Article 29

- (1) The PBJT rate is set at 10% (ten percent).
- (2) Special rate for PBJT rate on Food and/or Beverages provided by:
 - a. Restaurants in the form of stalls are set at 5% (five percent);

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- b. Restaurants in the form of cafeterias (taverns) amounted to 8% (eight percent);
 - c. Other restaurants by 10% (ten percent) and;
 - d. Food or catering service providers at 6% (six percent).
- (3) Special rate for PBJT on entertainment services of steam bath/spa is set at 40% (forty percent).
- (4) Special rate for PBJT on Electric Power for:
- a. consumption of Electric Power from other sources by industry, petroleum and natural gas mining, is set at 3% (three percent); and
 - b. consumption of self-generated Electric Power is set at a maximum of 1.5% (one point five percent).

Article 30

The principal amount of payable PBJT is calculated by multiplying the PBJT imposition basis as referred to in Article 27 by the PBJT rate as referred to in Article 29.

Article 31

The time of payable PBJT is determined when:

- a. Payment or delivery of Food and/or Drinks to PBJT for Food and/or Drinks;
- b. Consumption or payment for Electric Power for PBJT for Electric Power;
- c. Payment or delivery of Hospitality Services to PBJT for Hospitality Services;
- d. Payment or delivery of parking space provision services for PBJT for Parking Services; and
- e. Payment or delivery of Arts and Entertainment Services to PBJT for Arts and Entertainment Services.

Article 32

The PBJT collection area owed is the area where the sale, delivery and/or consumption of certain goods and services is carried out.

Paragraph 4

Advertisement Tax

Article 33

- (1) The object of Advertisement Tax is all advertisement operations.
- (2) Advertisement Tax Objects as referred to in section (1) involve:
- a. Advertising boards/billboards/videotrons/megatrons;
 - b. Fabric advertising;
 - c. Sticky advertising;
 - d. Leaflet advertising;
 - e. Mobile advertising, including on vehicles;
 - f. Aerial advertising;
 - g. Floating billboards;
 - h. Film/slide advertising; And
 - i. Demonstration advertisement.

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- (3) The following are excluded from Advertisement Tax:
- a. advertisements production via the internet, television, radio, daily news, weekly news, monthly news, and the like;
 - b. product labels/brands attached to traded goods, which serve to differentiate them from other similar products;
 - c. the name of the business or profession identifier which is attached to the building and/or in the business or profession area where the type, size, shape and material of the advertisement are regulated in a Mayor Regulation guided by the provisions governing the name of the business or profession identifier;
 - d. Advertisements organized by the Government or Regional Government; and
 - e. Advertisements produced in the context of political, social and religious activities without any commercial advertising.

Article 34

- (1) The subject of advertisement tax is the individual or entity that uses advertisements.
- (2) Advertisement Taxpayers are individuals or entities that organize advertisements.

Article 35

- (1) The basis imposition of advertisement tax is the rental value of advertisements.
- (2) In case that an advertisement is operated by a third party, the rental value of the advertisement as referred to in section (1) is determined based on the contract value of the advertisement.
- (3) In case that an advertisement is held independently, the rental value of the advertisement as referred to in section (1) is calculated by taking into account the factors of type, materials used, placement location, display time, period of operation, number and size of advertisement media.
- (4) In case that the advertising rental value as referred to in section (2) is unknown and/or considered unreasonable, the advertising rental value is determined using the factors as referred to in section (3).
- (5) Further provisions regarding the calculation of the rental value of Advertisements as referred to in section (3) are regulated by a Mayor Regulation.

Article 36

The Advertisement Tax rate is set at 20% (twenty percent).

Article 37

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The principal amount of Advertisement Tax payable is calculated by multiplying the basis Imposition of Advertisement Tax as referred to in Article 35 section (1) by the Advertisement Tax rate as referred to in Article 36.

Article 38

The period when the Advertisement Tax is payable is determined whereby the Advertisement is held.

Article 39

- (1) The Advertising Tax Collection Area that is payable is the Regional area where the Advertising is held.
- (2) Specifically for running advertisements as referred to in Article 33 section (2) point e, the area for collection of the advertisement tax payable is the regional area where the advertisement operator's business is registered.
- (3) Specifically for running advertisements as referred to in Article 33 section (2) point e, the advertisement tax payable is collected in the regional area where the advertisement operator's business is registered.

Paragraph 5

PAT

Article 40

- (1) The object of Groundwater Tax (PAT) is the extraction and/or utilization of ground water.
- (2) What being excluded from PAT objects are retrievals for:
 - a. basic household needs;
 - b. people's agricultural irrigation;
 - c. community fisheries;
 - d. people's livestock;
 - e. religious needs; And
 - f. Government and regional government activities.

Article 41

- (1) Subject of PAT is individual or entity that extracts and/or utilizes ground water.
- (2) PAT Taxpayers are individual or entity that extracts and/or utilizes ground water.

Article 42

- (1) The basis imposition of PAT is the value of groundwater acquisition.
- (2) The value of groundwater acquisition as referred to in section (1) is the result of multiplying the price of raw water and the weight of groundwater.

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- (3) The price of raw water as referred to in section (2) is determined based on the costs of maintaining and controlling ground water resources.
- (4) Groundwater weight as referred to in section (2) is expressed in a coefficient based on the following factors:
 - a. type of water source;
 - b. location of water source;
 - c. purpose of water extraction and/or utilization;
 - d. volume of water extraction and/or utilized;
 - e. water quality; and
 - f. the level of environmental damage caused by water extraction and/or use.
- (5) The amount of groundwater acquisition value as referred to in section (2) is regulated by a Mayor Regulation based on the groundwater acquisition value determined by the Governor.

Article 43

The PAT rate is set at 10% (ten percent).

Article 44

The principal amount of PAT payable is calculated by multiplying the basis imposition of PAT as referred to in Article 42 section (1) by the PAT rate as referred to in Article 43.

Article 45

PAT is considered as payable whereby the extraction and/or utilization of groundwater occurs.

Article 46

The PAT collection area owed is the regional area where groundwater is collected and/or utilized.

Paragraph 6

Piggyback Tax for Motor Vehicle (Opsen PKB)

Article 47

Opsen PKB is imposed on the payable motor vehicle tax (PKB).

Article 48

- (1) Opsen PKB Taxpayers are PKB Taxpayers.

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- (2) Collection of Opsen PKB is carried out simultaneously with collection of Tax payable from PKB.

Article 49

The basis imposition of Opsen PKB is the payable PKB.

Article 50

The PKB Opsen rate is set at 66% (sixty six percent).

Article 51

- (1) The principal amount of Opsen PKB payable is calculated by multiplying the basis imposition of Opsen PKB as referred to in Article 49 by the Opsen PKB rate as referred to in Article 50.
- (2) Further provisions regarding the procedures for collecting Opsen PKB as referred to in section (1) are regulated by or based on statutory regulations.

Article 52

Opsen PKB is considered as payable whereby the PKB is payable.

Article 53

Opsen PKB Collection Area that is payable is the Regional Area where the Motorized Vehicle is registered.

Paragraph 7

Vehicle Duty (Opsen BBNKB)

Article 54

Vehicle Duty (Opsen BBNKB) is imposed on the BBNKB payable.

Article 55

- (1) Opsen BBNKB Taxpayers are BBNKB Taxpayers.
- (2) Collection of Opsen BBNKB is carried out simultaneously with collection of Tax payable from BBNKB.

Article 56

The basis imposition of Opsen BBNKB Opsen is the BBNKB payable.

Article 57

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The rate of Opsen BBNKB is set at 66% (sixty six percent).

Article 58

- (1) The principal amount of Opsen BBNKB payable is calculated by multiplying the basis imposition of Opsen BBNKB as referred to in Article 56 by the rate of Opsen BBNKB as referred to in Article 57.
- (2) Further provisions regarding the procedures for collecting Opsen as referred to in section (1) are regulated by or based on statutory regulations

Article 59

Opsen BBNKB is set as payable is whereby BBNKB is payable.

Article 60

The Opsen BBNKB payable Collection area is the Regional area where the Motorized Vehicle is registered.

Part Three

Tax Period and Tax Year

Article 61

- (1) The Tax is set as payable when an individual or entity has fulfilled the subjective and objective requirements for a type of Tax within a certain period of time in a Tax period, in a Tax year, or in a Part of a Tax year in accordance with the provisions of regional tax laws and regulations.
- (2) The Tax Period applies to types of Tax collected based on statutory regulations as referred to in Article 3 section (2), except for BPHTB as referred to in Article 3 section (2) point a.
- (3) The Tax Period as referred to in section (2) is determined for a period of 1 (one) calendar month or another period of no more than 3 (three) calendar months, which becomes the basis for Taxpayers to calculate, deposit and report the Tax payable.
- (4) The Tax Year as referred to in section (1) is a period of 1 (one) calendar year, unless the Taxpayer uses a financial year that is not the same as the calendar year.
- (5) The tax period and tax year are determined by Mayor Regulation.

Part Four

Use of Tax Revenues for Predetermined Activities

Article 62

- (1) The proceeds from Opsen PKB as referred to in Article 3 section (1) point h shall be allocated at least 10% (ten percent) for the construction and/or maintenance of roads as well as improving modes and facilities of public transportation.

- (2) The proceeds from PBJT for Electric Power as referred to in Article 3 section (2) point c number 2, shall be allocated at least 10% (ten percent) for the provision of public street lighting.
- (3) Activities for providing public street lighting as referred to in section (2) include the provision and maintenance of public street lighting infrastructure as well as payment of costs for electricity consumption for public street lighting.
- (4) The proceeds from PAT as referred to in Article 3 section (1) point e, shall be allocated at least 10% (ten percent) for the prevention, control, and restoration of pollution and/or environmental damage in the Region which has an impact on the quality and quantity of ground water , including but not limited to:
 - a. tree planting;
 - b. making holes or absorption wells;
 - c. forests or trees preservation; and
 - d. waste management.

CHAPTER III
REGIONAL RETRIBUTION

Part One

Type of Retributions

Article 63

Type of Retributions:

- a. General Service Retribution;
- b. Business Service Retribution; and
- c. Certain Permit Retribution.

Part Two

General Service Retribution

Article 64

- (1) Types of services that are objects of General Service Retribution as referred to in Article 63 point a include:
 - a. Health services;
 - b. Cleaning services;
 - c. Parking services on the side of the public streets; and
 - d. Traditional market services.
- (2) Services that are objects of General Service Retribution as referred to in section (1) are services provided or given by the Regional Government based on Regional authority as regulated in the provisions of statutory regulations.
- (3) Excluded from the objects of the General Services Retribution type as referred to in section (1) are services provided by the central government, state-owned enterprises, regional-owned enterprises, and private parties.
- (4) Services as referred to in section (2) include services provided by Regional Public Service Agency (BLUD).

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- (5) Details of the objects of services provided by BLUD as referred to in section (4), are regulated in the Mayor Regulations in accordance with the provisions of statutory regulations.
- (6) Details of Retribution objects as regulated in the Mayor Regulation as referred to in section (5) shall:
 - a. not contravene the higher laws and regulations;
 - b. not obstruct the investment climate in the Region; and
 - c. not cause high economic costs.
- (7) The Mayor Regulation as referred to in section (5) is submitted to the minister who administers government affairs in the financial sector, the minister who administers domestic government affairs, and the Regional House of Representatives (DPRD) no later than 7 (seven) working days after the Mayor Regulation is stipulated.

Article 65

- (1) Subject of General Services Retribution is an Individual or Entity that uses or enjoys the General Services.
- (2) Retribution Obligors for General Services is an individual or entity who, according to statutory regulations, is required to pay Retribution for the service of General Services.

Article 66

Health services as referred to in Article 64 section (1) point a are health services at community health centers, mobile health centers, supporting community health centers, medical centers, regional general hospitals, and other similar health service places owned and/or managed by the Regional Government, except administrative services.

Article 67

- (1) Cleaning Services as referred to in Article 64 section (1) are cleaning services organized by the Regional Government including:
 - a. Picking up or collecting waste from its source to the location of temporary landfill;
 - b. transporting waste from its source and/or temporary disposal location to the final waste disposal location or waste processing or final destruction; and
 - c. provision of locations for disposal or processing or final destruction of waste.
 - d. providing and/or suctioning latrines; and
 - e. processing household, office and industrial liquid waste.
- (2) Cleaning services for public streets, parks, places of worship, social and other public places are excluded from Cleaning Services.

Article 68

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- (1) Parking Services at the side of public streets as referred to in Article 64 section (1) point c is the provision of parking services at the side of public streets determined by the Regional Government in accordance with the provisions of statutory regulations.
- (2) Retribution collection for parking services at the side of public streets as referred to in section (1) is carried out by:
 - a. subscribing;
 - b. non subscribing; and
 - c. incidental.
- (3) Implementation of retribution collection for parking services at the side of public streets by subscription as referred to in section (2) point a is carried out in a cooperative manner in accordance with statutory provisions.
- (4) Implementation of retribution collection for parking services at the side of public streets by non subscription as referred to in section (2) point b is applied to any motorized vehicles plates registered at other Region.
- (5) Pelaksanaan pemungutan Retribusi Pelayanan Parkir di Tepi Jalan Umum secara insidentil sebagaimana dimaksud pada Section (2) huruf c dikenakan atas pelayanan parkir kegiatan insidentil. Implementation of retribution collection for parking services at the side of public streets by incidental as referred to in section (2) point c is applied to the parking services for incidental events.

Article 69

Traditional Market Services as referred to in Article 64 section (1) point d are the provision of traditional or simple market facilities, in the form of courtyards, stalls, kiosks managed by the Regional Government.

Article 70

- (1) The level of services for Public Services is the amount of service which is used as the basis for the allocation of the cost burden borne by the Regional Government for the provision of the services concerned.
- (2) The level of service use for Public Services as referred to in section (1) is determined by the following provisions:
 - a. health services measured based on the type of service, frequency of service, and/or period of service;
 - b. cleaning services measured based on the type of service, frequency of service, volume and/or type of trash/toilet waste/liquid waste;
 - c. parking services on public streets measured based on vehicle type, frequency of service and/or duration of use of the parking space; and

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d. market services measured based on service frequency, period of use of market facilities and/or type of use of market facilities.

Article 71

- (1) The principles and targets in determining Public Service Retribution rates are determined by taking into account the costs of providing the services concerned, the capacity of the community, aspects of justice, and the effectiveness of control over the services.
- (2) The costs as referred to in section (1) include operational and maintenance costs, interest costs and capital costs.
- (3) In the event that the rate determination fully takes into account the costs of providing services, the rate determination is only to cover part of the costs as referred to in section (2).
- (4) The principles and targets in determining the Public Service Retribution rates provided by BLUD are determined in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations regarding BLUD.

Article 72

- (1) The amount of Public Service Retribution payable is calculated by multiplying the level of service use as referred to in Article 67 by the Retribution rate.
- (2) Struktur dan besaran tarif Retribusi Jasa Umum tercantum dalam Lampiran I yang merupakan bagian tidak terpisahkan dari Peraturan Daerah ini. The structure and amount of the General Services Retribution rates are listed in Appendix I and has been an integral part of this Regional Regulation.
- (3) Retribution rates are reviewed no later than once every 3 (three) years.
- (4) The review of Retribution rates as referred to in section (3) is carried out by taking into account the price index and economic development, without adding objects to the General Services Retribution.
- (5) Retribution Rate resulting from the review as referred to in section (3) is determined by a Mayor Regulation.

Part Four

Business Service Retribution

Article 73

- (1) Types of provision/service of goods and/or services which are objects of Business Services Retribution as referred to in Article 63 point b include:
 - a. provision of places for business activities in the form of wholesale markets, shops and other places for business activities;

- b. provision of place for auctioning fish, livestock, agricultural products and forest products including other facilities within the auction place;
 - c. provision of special off-street parking areas;
 - d. livestock slaughterhouse services;
 - e. recreation, tourism and sports services;
 - f. sales of Regional Government business production; and
 - g. use of Regional assets that do not interfere with the implementation of the duties and functions of regional working units and/or optimization of Regional assets without changing ownership status in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.
- (2) The provisions or services as referred to in section (1) are provided or given by the Regional Government based on the services being provided and the Regional authority as regulated in the provisions of laws and regulations.
- (3) Services as referred to in section (2) include services provided by BLUD.
- (4) In the event that there is an adjustment to the detailed object details for the services provided by BLUD as referred to in section (3), the adjustment to the detailed object details is regulated in a Mayor Regulation in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.
- (5) Details of Retribution objects regulated in the Mayor Regulation as referred to in section (4) shall:
- a. not contravene the higher laws and regulation;
 - b. not obstruct the investment climate in the Region; and
 - c. not cause high economic costs.
- (6) The Mayor Regulation as referred to in section (4) is submitted to the minister who carries out government affairs in the financial sector, the minister who handles domestic government affairs, and the DPRD no later than 7 (seven) working days after the Mayor Regulation is stipulated.
- (7) Services provided by the central government, state-owned enterprises, regional-owned enterprises and private parties are excluded from the objects of the Business Services Retribution type as referred to in section (1).

Article 74

- (1) Subject of Business Services Retribution is an individual or entity that uses or enjoys Business Services services.
- (2) Business Services Retribution Obligors is an individual or entity who, according to laws and regulations, is required to pay Retribution for Business Services services.

Article 75

The provision of places for business activities in the form of wholesale markets, shops and other places of business activities as referred to in Article 73 section (1) point a is the provision of places for business activities in the form of wholesale market facilities,

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and rented market/shop facilities, as well as places for other business activities which are provided/organized by the Regional Government.

Article 76

- (1) The provision of auction places for fish, livestock, agricultural products and forest products including other facilities within the auction location as referred to in Article 73 section (1) point b constitutes the provision of auction places specifically provided by the Regional Government to conduct fish auctions, livestock, agricultural products and forest products including auction services and other facilities provided at the auction place.
- (2) A place rented by the Regional Government from another party to be used as an auction place is included as the provision of an auction place as referred to in section (1)

Article 77

Auctions originating from fishing vessels or fish transporters with a gross tonnage (GT) exceeding 30 (three tens) tons are excluded from the objects of Retribution for Providing Auction Places for Fish, Livestock, Earth Products and Forest Products, including other facilities in the auction location environment.

Article 78

The provision of special off-street parking spaces as referred to in Article 73 section (1) letter c is the provision of special off-street parking spaces which are provided, owned and/or managed by the Regional Government.

Article 79

The livestock slaughterhouse service as referred to in Article 73 section (1) point d is a service providing facilities for slaughtering livestock including animal health inspection services before and after slaughter, which are provided, owned and/or managed by the Regional Government.

Article 80

Recreation, tourism and sports services as referred to in Article 73 section (1) point e are recreation, tourism and sports services provided, owned and/or managed by the Regional Government.

Article 81

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<u>Koordinasi</u>		

The sales of Regional Government business production as referred to in Article 73 section (1) point f is the sale of regional business production carried out by the Regional Government.

Article 82

Use of Regional assets that does not interfere with the implementation of the duties and functions of regional working units and/or optimization of Regional assets without changing ownership status in accordance with the provisions of statutory regulations.

Article 83

- (1) The level of service usage for Business Services is the amount of service usage which is used as the basis for the allocation of the cost burden borne by the Regional Government for the provision of the related services.
- (2) The level of service usage for Business Services as referred to in section (1) is set with the following provisions:
 - a. provision of places for business activities is measured based on the area of the business premises, frequency of services, and/or period of use of Wholesale Market facilities, Shops, and/or other business places;
 - b. provision of an auction venue is measured based on the area of the auction venue, frequency of services, and/or the period of use of the auction venue facilities;
 - c. provision of special off-street parking areas is measured based on the type of vehicle, frequency of service, and/or the period of use of special off-street parking facilities;
 - d. livestock slaughterhouse services are measured based on the type of livestock, type of service, frequency of service, and/or duration of use of the slaughterhouse facilities;
 - e. services at recreation, tourism and sports venues are measured based on the type of facility, frequency of service, and/or duration of use of recreation, tourism and sports facilities;
 - f. penjualan produksi usaha Daerah diukur berdasarkan jenis dan/atau volume produksi usaha Daerah; dan sales of Regional business production are measured based on the type and/or volume of Regional business production; and
 - g. use of Regional asset is measured based on the type of service, service frequency, and/or period of use of Regional assets.

Article 84

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<u>Koordinasi</u>		

- (1) Principles and targets in determining the Business Services Retribution rates to obtain good profits.
- (2) Good profits as referred to in section (1) is the profit obtained if the business services are carried out efficiently and oriented towards market prices.
- (3) Principles and targets in determining the Business Services Retribution rates provided by BLUD are determined in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations governing BLUD.

Article 85

- (1) The size of Business Services Retribution payable is calculated by multiplying the level of service usage as referred to in Article 83 by the Retribution rate.
- (2) The structure and size of the Business Services Retribution rates are listed in Appendix II which is an integral part of this Regional Regulation.
- (3) The use of Regional Assets in the form of:
 - a. leases of which the period term is more than 1 (one) year;
 - b. cooperation of utilization;
 - c. build operate transfer or build transfer operate; or
 - d. cooperation of infrastructure provision;
 has spesific rate calculation under Mayor Regulation.
- (4) Pengaturan lebih lanjut mengenai bentuk pemanfaatan Barang Milik Daerah dan penghitungan besaran tarif sebagaimana dimaksud pada Section (3) ditetapkan dengan Peraturan Wali Kota. Further regulations on the form of use of Regional Assets and the calculation of the rate as referred to in section (3) are set by a Mayor Regulation.
- (5) The Mayor Regulation as referred to in section (4) may be stipulated for each implementation of the use of Regional Assets.
- (6) The form of use of Regional assets as referred to in section (4) shall:
 - a. not contravene the higher laws and regulation;
 - b. not obstruct the investment climate in the Region; and
 - c. not cause high economic costs.
- (7) Pemanfaatan barang milik Daerah sebagaimana dimaksud pada Section (3) dilaksanakan sesuai dengan ketentuan peraturan perundang-undangan yang mengatur mengenai pengelolaan Barang Milik Daerah. The use of Regional assets as referred to in section (3) is carried out in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations governing the management of Regional assets.
- (8) Retribution rate shall be reviewed no later than once in 3 (three) years.
- (9) The review of Retribution rates as referred to in section (3) is carried out by taking into account the price index and economic development, without adding additional Business Services Retribution objects.

(10) The Retribution Rate resulting from the review as referred to in section (3) is determined by a Mayor Regulation.

Part Five

Certain Permits Retribution

Article 86

- (1) Types of permit-granting services that is the object of Retribution of Certain Permit as referred to in Article 63 point c include:
 - a. Building Approval (PBG); and
 - b. Use of Foreign Workers.
- (2) Services as referred to in section (1) are provided or given by the Regional Government based on Regional authority as regulated in the laws regulations.
- (3) Permit services carried out by the central government, state-owned enterprises, regional-owned enterprises and private parties are excluded from the objects of types of Certain Permits Retribution as referred to in section (1).

Article 87

- (1) Subject of Certain Permits Retribution is Individual or Entity who use/enjoy the granting of Certain Permits.
- (2) Certain Permits Retribution Obligors is Individual or Entity who according to laws and regulations is required to pay Retribution for the granting of Certain Permits.

Article 88

- (1) PBG service as referred to in Article 86 section (1) point a include the issuance of PBG and Certificate of Worthiness (SLF) by the Regional Government in accordance with laws and regulations.
- (2) The issuance of PBG and SLF as referred to in section (1) include the service activity of consultation on compliance with technical standards, issuance of PBG, building inspections, issuance of SLF and Certificate of Building Ownership (SBKKBG), as well as printing of SLF plaques.
- (3) The PBG and SLF are issued for approval of following requests:
 - a. New construction;
 - b. Buildings that have been completed and have no PBG and/or SLF;
 - c. PBG revised for:
 1. changes of Building functionality;
 2. changes of Building layers;
 3. changes of Building total area;
 4. changes of Building appearance;

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5. changes of specifications and dimension of components in the Building that affects the aspect of safety and/or health;
 6. strengthening the Building against moderate or severe levels of damage;
 7. protection and/or development of cultural heritage Building; or
 8. repair of Buildings located in cultural heritage areas.
- d. Revision of PBG is not required for maintenance work and care work..
- (4) Excluded from the imposition of retribution for services as referred to in paragraph (1) are the granting of permits for approval of buildings owned by the Government, Regional Government, and buildings which have a religious or worship function.

Article 89

- (1) The service for the use of Foreign Workers as referred to in Article 86 point b is a service for the ratification of plans for the use of foreign workers for extension in the Region in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations regarding the use of foreign workers. Ratification of plans for the use of foreign workers for extension in accordance with the work area of the foreign workers in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations regarding the use of foreign workers.
- (2) Excluded from the service for the ratification of plans for the use of foreign workers for extension as referred to in section (1) which are not subject to Retribution are specifically for the use of foreign workers by central government agencies, regional government agencies, foreign country representatives, international bodies, social institutions, religious institutions and certain positions in educational institutions.

Article 90

- (1) The level of service use for Certain Licensing services is the amount of service that is used as the basis for allocating the cost burden borne by the Regional Government for the provision of the relevant services.
- (2) The level of use of services for Certain Licensing services as referred to in section (1) is set by the provisions as follows:
 - a. building approval services are measured based on a formula that reflects the costs of providing the service; and
 - b. services for the use of foreign workers are measured based on the frequency of service provision and/or service period.
- (3) The formula as referred to in section (2) point a consists of:
 - a. formula for building construction, including:
 1. Total Floor Area;
 2. Integrated Index; and
 3. Built Building Index.

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- b. formula for Building Infrastructure, including:
 - 1. Volume;
 - 2. Building Infrastructure Index; and
 - 3. Built Building Index.

Article 91

- (1) The principles and targets in determining the amount of the Specific Licensing Fee are based on the objective of covering some or all of the costs of organizing the granting of the permit in question.
- (2) The costs of organizing the granting of the permit as referred to in section (1) include the costs of issuing permit documents, supervision, law enforcement, administration, and/or the costs of the negative impacts of the granting of the permit.
- (3) Building approval services as referred to in Article 88 section (1), the costs of organizing the services take into consideration the details of the services as regulated in the laws and regulations concerning building construction.
- (4) Services for ratifying plans for the use of foreign workers for extension as referred to in Article 89 section (1), the costs of organizing the granting of the permit take into consideration the details of the services as regulated in the laws and regulations concerning the use of foreign workers.

Article 92

- (1) The amount of Certain Licensing Retribution owed is calculated by multiplying the level of service usage as referred to in Article 90 by the Retribution rate.
- (2) Specifically for Certain Licensing Retribution for PBG services, the amount of Retribution owed is calculated based on the multiplication of the level of service usage for the provision of PBG services by the unit price of the PBG Retribution.
- (3) The unit price of the PBG Retribution as referred to in section (2) consists of:
 - a. Standard for Highest Construction Cost (SHST) for Buildings; or
 - b. Unit Price of Building Infrastructure (HSPBG) for Building Infrastructure.
- (4) The Retribution rate as referred to in section (1) is the rupiah value set to calculate the amount of Retribution owed.
- (5) In the event that the Retribution rate as referred to in section (2) is stated in a currency other than the rupiah, payment of the Retribution in question must still be made in rupiah using the exchange rate set by the minister who organizes Government Affairs in the financial sector for tax purposes.
- (6) The structure and amount of the Certain Licensing Retribution rates are listed in Attachment III which is an integral part of this Regional Regulation.
- (7) The Retribution Rate may be reviewed at most once every 3 (three) years.

- (8) The review of the Retribution Rate as referred to in section (6) is carried out by taking into account the price index and economic development, without adding the object of the Certain Licensing Retribution.
- (9) The review of the Retribution Rate as referred to in section (7) specifically for PBG services is only for the amount of price or index in the HSBGN or SHST table and the Locality Index.
- (10) The review of the Retribution Rate as referred to in section (7) specifically for PTKA services is based on the rate stipulated in government regulations concerning the types and rates for types of Non-Tax State Revenue applicable to the ministry that organizes government affairs in the field of manpower.
- (11) The Retribution Rate resulting from the review as referred to in section (8) and section (9) shall be stipulated by the Mayor's Regulation.

Part Five
Utilization of Retribution Revenue
Article 93

- (1) The use of the receipts from each type of Retribution is prioritized to fund activities directly related to the provision of the relevant service.
- (2) The use of the receipts from Retributions collected and managed by BLUD can be directly used to fund the provision of BLUD services in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations regarding BLUD.
- (3) Further provisions regarding the use of Retribution receipts as referred to in section (1) and section (2) are regulated by the Mayor's Regulation.

CHAPTER IV
TAX AND RETRIBUTION COLLECTION

Part One
Tax Collection
Article 94

- (1) Taxpayers for types of Tax collected based on the Mayor's determination as referred to in Article 4 section (1) and Taxpayers for types of Tax collected based on self-calculation as referred to in Article 4 section (2) are required to register themselves and/or their Tax objects to the Mayor or appointed Official.
- (2) The Mayor or appointed Official shall conduct data collection on Taxpayers and/or Tax objects to obtain, complete, and administer data on Tax objects and/or

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Taxpayers, including geographic information on Tax objects for regional tax administration purposes.

- (3) Documents used as the basis for collecting types of Tax collected based on the Mayor's determination as referred to in section (1) include SKPD and SPPT.
- (4) Documents used as the basis for collecting types of Tax collected based on self-calculation as referred to in section (1) include SPTPD.
- (5) Specifically for BPHTB, SSPD is considered the same as SPTPD.
- (6) The Mayor or appointed Official may issue STPD for types of Tax collected based on the Mayor's determination as referred to in Article 4 section (1) and for types of Tax collected based on self-calculation as referred to in Article 4 section (2).
- (7) Tax Debts as stated in the SPPT, SKPD, SKPKDB, SPKDKBT, STPD, Correction Decision Letter, Objection Decision Letter, and Appeal Decision are the basis for Tax Collection.
- (8) Further provisions regarding the procedures for Tax collection are regulated in the Mayor's Regulation.

Part Two

Retribution Collection

Article 95

- (1) The amount of Retribution owed is determined by SKRD or other equivalent documents, either in the form of printed documents or electronic documents.
- (2) Other equivalent documents can be in the form of tickets, coupons, subscription cards, BLUD bills, and payment notification letters from electronic service or licensing applications.
- (3) Further provisions regarding the procedures for collecting Retribution are regulated in the Mayor's Regulation.

Part Three

Expiration of Tax and Levy Billing

Article 96

- (1) The rights to collect Tax shall expire after 5 (five) years from the time the Tax is owed, unless the Taxpayer commits a crime in the field of Regional taxation.
- (2) In the event that the time the Tax is owed for the type of Tax collected based on the Mayor's determination is different from the time the SKPD or SPPT is determined as referred to in Article 94 section (3), the 5 (five) year period as referred to in section (1) is calculated from the time the SKPD or SPPT is determined.

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- (3) The Tax Collection Expiration as referred to in section (1) is suspended if before the period as referred to in paragraph (2):
 - a. a Warning Letter and/or a Distress Letter is issued; or
 - b. there is an acknowledgment of Tax Debt from the Taxpayer, either directly or indirectly.
- (4) In the event that a Warning Letter and/or a Distress Letter is issued as referred to in section (3) letter a, the Collection Expiration is calculated from the date the Warning Letter and/or Distress Letter is delivered.
- (5) Direct recognition of Tax Debt as referred to in section (3) point b is a Taxpayer consciously stating that the Taxpayer still has Tax Debt and has not paid to the Regional Government.
- (6) Indirect recognition of Tax Debt as referred to in section (3) letter b can be known from the submission of an application for installments or postponement of payment and an objection application by the Taxpayer.
- (7) In the event that there is a recognition of Tax Debt from the Taxpayer as referred to in paragraph (3) letter b, the Collection expiration is calculated from the date of such recognition.

Article 97

- (1) The rights to collect retribution expires after 3 (three) years from the time the retribution is owed, unless the Retribution Obligor commits a crime in the field of Retribution.
- (2) The expiration of the Retribution Collection as referred to in section (1) is suspended if:
 - a. a Warning Letter is issued; or
 - b. there is an acknowledgment of the Retribution debt from the Retribution Obligor, either directly or indirectly.
- (3) In the event that a Warning Letter is issued as referred to in section (2) point a, the expiration of the Collection is calculated from the date of receipt of the Warning Letter.
- (4) The direct acknowledgment of the Retribution debt as referred to in section (2) point b is the Retribution Obligor consciously stating that the Obligor still has a Retribution debt and has not paid to the Regional Government.
- (5) The indirect acknowledgment of the Retribution debt as referred to in section (2) point b can be known from the submission of an application for installments or postponement of payment and an objection application by the Retribution Obligor.

Part Four

Write-off of Tax and Retribution Receivables

Article 98

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- (1) The Mayor manages Tax receivables to determine the priority of Tax Collection.
- (2) The Mayor or the appointed Official orders the Tax Bailiff to carry out Tax Collection in accordance with the provisions of the laws and regulations.
- (3) Tax Receivables that can no longer be collected because the right to carry out Collection has expired can be written off.
- (4) Tax Receivables that are written off as referred to in section (3) are stipulated in the Mayor's Decree.
- (5) The Mayor's Decree as referred to in section (4) is stipulated after Collection has been carried out up to the expiration of the Collection deadline as referred to in Article 97 section (1) or section (2), proven by the Collection implementation documents.
- (6) The stipulation of the Mayor's Decree as referred to in section (4) is carried out by considering the results of coordination with the internal supervisory personnel of the Regional Government.
- (7) Further provisions regarding the procedures for writing off Tax receivables are regulated in the Mayor's Regulation.

Article 99

- (1) Retribution receivables that can no longer be collected because the right to collect has expired can be written off.
- (2) The Mayor shall determine the Decision to Write Off Retribution Receivables that have expired as referred to in section (1).
- (3) The procedure for writing off Retribution receivables that have expired is regulated by the Mayor's Regulation.

Part Five

Deposit or Payment

Article 100

- (1) The Land Deed Official/Notary may only sign the deed of transfer of land and/or building rights after the Taxpayer submits proof of payment of BPHTB.
- (2) The head of the office in charge of State auction services may only sign the minutes of auction for the acquisition of land and/or building rights after the Taxpayer submits proof of payment of BPHTB.
- (3) The head of the land office may only register land rights or register the transfer of land rights after the Taxpayer submits proof of payment of BPHTB.
- (4) In the event that the acquisition of land and/or building rights as stipulated in laws and regulations is not an object of BPHTB, the Mayor may issue a certificate of non-object of BPHTB.

Article 101

- (1) The Official Land Deed Maker/Notary is required to:
 - a. request proof of BPHTB payment from the Taxpayer, before signing the deed of transfer of Land and/or Building Rights; and
 - b. report the making of deeds on land and/or buildings as referred to in Article 100 section (1) to the Mayor no later than 10 (tenth) day of the following month.

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- (2) In the event that the Official Land Deed Maker/Notary violates the obligations as referred to in section (1), administrative sanctions shall be imposed in the form of:
 - a. a fine of IDR 7,500,000.00 (seven million and five hundred thousand rupiah) for each violation as referred to in section (1); and/or
 - b. a fine of IDR 1,000,000.00 (one million rupiah) for each report as referred to in section (1).
- (3) The head of the office in charge of state auction services is required to:
 - a. request proof of BPHTB payment from the Taxpayer, before signing the auction minutes; and
 - b. report the auction minutes to the Mayor no later than the 10th (tenth) day of the following month.
- (4) The head of the office in charge of state auction services who violates the provisions as referred to in section (3) shall be subject to sanctions in accordance with the provisions of statutory regulations.
- (5) The reporting procedures for officials as referred to in section (1) and section (3) shall be further regulated by the Mayor's Regulation.

Article 102

- (1) The head of the land office may only register land rights or register the transfer of land rights after the Taxpayer submits proof of payment of BPHTB.
- (2) The head of the land office who violates the provisions as referred to in paragraph (1) shall be subject to sanctions in accordance with the provisions of laws and regulations.

CHAPTER V

REDUCTION, RELIEF, EXEMPTION, WRITE-OFF OR POSTPONEMENT OF PAYMENT OF TAX PRINCIPAL, RETRIBUTION PRINCIPAL, AND/OR SANCTIONS

Article 103

- (1) In supporting investment facilitation policies, the Mayor may provide fiscal incentives to business actors in the Region
- (2) Fiscal incentives as referred to in paragraph (1) are in the form of reductions, relief, and exemptions or write-off of principal Tax, principal Retribution, and/or sanctions.
- (3) Fiscal incentives as referred to in section (1) may be granted upon request of Taxpayers and/or Retribution Obligors or granted ex officio by the Mayor based on considerations, including:
 - a. the ability to pay of Taxpayers and/or Retribution Obligors;
 - b. certain conditions of Tax objects, such as Tax objects affected by natural disasters, fires, and/or other causes that occur not due to any deliberate elements carried out by Taxpayers and/or other parties with the aim of avoiding paying Tax;
 - c. to support and protect micro and ultra micro business actors;
 - d. to support Regional policies in achieving Regional priority programs; and/or

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- e. to support central government policies in achieving national priority programs.
- (4) The granting of fiscal incentives as referred to in section (1) shall be stipulated in a Regional Regulation and notified to the regional legislative council.
- (5) The notification to the regional legislative council as referred to in section (4) shall be accompanied by the Mayor's considerations in granting fiscal incentives.
- (6) Further provisions regarding the administration and procedures for providing fiscal incentives are regulated by the Mayor's Regulation.

Article 104

- (1) The Mayor or appointed Official may provide relief, reduction, exemption, and postponement of payment of principal and/or sanctions of Tax and/or Retribution by considering the conditions of the Taxpayer or Retribution Obligors and/or Tax object or Retribution object.
- (2) The provision of relief, reduction, exemption, and postponement of payment as referred to in section (1) is carried out by considering the conditions of the Taxpayer or Retribution Obligor and/or Tax object or Retribution object.
- (3) The conditions of the Taxpayer as referred to in section (1) include the Taxpayer's ability to pay or the Taxpayer's liquidity level.
- (4) The conditions of the Tax object as referred to in section (1) include very limited agricultural land, land and buildings occupied by Taxpayers from certain groups, the value of the Tax object up to a certain limit, and Tax objects affected by natural disasters, fires, riots, and/or unrest.
- (5) Further provisions regarding the provision of relief, reduction, exemption, and postponement of payment as referred to in paragraph (1) are regulated in the Mayor's Regulation.

CHAPTER VI

CONFIDENTIALITY OF TAXPAYER DATA

Article 105

- (1) Any official is prohibited from informing another party anything known or disclosed to him by the Taxpayer in the context of his position or work to implement the provisions of laws and regulations in the field of Regional taxation.
- (2) The prohibition as referred to in section (1) also applies to experts appointed by the Mayor to assist in implementing the provisions of laws and regulations in the field of Regional taxation.
- (3) Those excluded from the provisions as referred to in section (1) and section (2) are:
 - a. Officials and/or experts acting as witnesses or experts in court hearings; and

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- b. Officials and/or experts appointed by the Mayor to provide information to officials of state institutions or government agencies authorized to conduct audits in the field of Regional Finance.
- (4) For the interests of the Region, the Mayor is authorized to grant written permission to officials as referred to in section (1) and experts as referred to in section (2), to provide information, show written evidence from or about Taxpayers to the appointed party.
- (5) For the purposes of examination in court in criminal or civil cases, at the request of a judge in accordance with criminal procedure law and civil procedure law, the Mayor may grant written permission to officials as referred to in section (1), and experts as referred to in section (2), to provide and show written evidence and information from the Taxpayer in his possession.
- (6) The request of the judge as referred to in section (5) must state the name of the suspect or the name of the defendant, the information requested, and the connection between the criminal or civil case in question and the information requested.

CHAPTER VII
CRIMINAL PROVISIONS

Article 106

Taxpayers who due to their omission and/or intentionally do not fulfill their tax obligations, thereby causing losses to Regional Finances, are subject to criminal penalties in accordance with the provisions of applicable laws and regulations

Article 107

Criminal acts in the field of regional taxation may not be prosecuted if they have exceeded a period of 5 (five) years from the time the tax is owed or the tax period ends or part of the tax year ends or the tax year in question ends.

Article 108

Retribution obligors who do not fulfill their obligation to pay for services used/enjoyed, thus causing losses to Regional Finances, are threatened with imprisonment for a maximum of 3 (three) months or a fine of a maximum of 3 (three) times the amount of Retribution owed that has not been paid or is underpaid.

Article 109

Pejabat atau tenaga ahli yang melanggar larangan kerahasiaan data Wajib Pajak, diancam dengan pidana berdasarkan peraturan perundang-undangan.

CHAPTER X
TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

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Article 110

The provisions regarding the Opsen PKB and Opsen BBNKB come into effect in accordance with the provisions as stated in the laws and regulations.

Article 111

At the time when this Regional Regulation comes into force, all Mayoral Regulations which are the implementation of the Regional Regulations governing Regional Taxes and Regional Retributions are declared to remain in effect as long as they do not conflict with and have not been changed based on this Regional Regulation.

CHAPTER XI

CLOSING PROVISIONS

Article 112

At the time when this Regional Regulation comes into force, then:

- a. Regional Regulation of Probolinggo City Number 2 of 2011 concerning Regional Taxes (Regional Gazette of Probolinggo City of 2011 Number 2);

REGIONAL REGULATION OF PROBOLINGGO CITY
NUMBER 4 OF 2023
ON
REGIONAL TAX AND REGIONAL RETRIBUTION

I. GENERAL :

With the enactment of Law Number 1 of 2022 on Financial Relations Between the Central Government and Regional Governments, Regions are given the authority to collect Taxes and Retributions by strengthening through restructuring the types of Tax, providing new sources of Regional taxation, simplifying types of Retribution, and harmonization with Law Number 11 of 2020 on Job Creation. Tax restructuring is carried out through reclassification of 5 (five) types of consumption-based Taxes into one type of Tax, namely PBJT. This aims to:

- a. align Tax Objects between central and regional taxes so as to avoid duplication of tax collection;
- b. simplify tax administration so that the benefits obtained are higher compared to collection costs;
- c. facilitate monitoring of integrated Tax collection by Regions; and
- d. facilitate the people to fulfill their tax obligations, while supporting ease of doing business with the simplification of tax administration.

In addition to the integration of consumption-based Regional taxes, PBJT regulates the expansion of Tax Objects including parking lots | recreational objects, and rental of sports facilities and infrastructure (sports game objects). The government also provides the authority to collect Piggyback Tax (Opsen) between the provincial and regency/city government levels, namely PKB, BBNKB. Opsen on PKB and BBNKB is actually a transfer of provincial tax revenue sharing. This can increase Regional independence without increasing the burden on Taxpayers, because tax revenue will be recorded as PAD (regional revenue), as well as provide certainty on Tax revenue and provide flexibility in spending on such revenue at each level of government compared to the revenue sharing scheme. Piggyback Tax also encourages the role of the Region to carry out Regional tax extension.

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Simplification of Retribution is carried out through rationalization of the amount of Retribution. Retribution is classified into 3 (three) types, namely General Service Retribution, Business Service Retribution, and Certain Licensing Retribution. Furthermore, the number of types of Retribution Objects is simplified from 32 (thirty-two) types to 18 (eighteen) types of services. The rationalization aims to ensure that the Retributions to be collected by the Regional Government are Retributions that can be collected effectively, and with low collection costs and compliance costs. In addition, rationalization is intended to reduce the burden on the community in accessing basic public services that are the responsibility of the Regional Government. Rationalization is also in line with the implementation of Law Number 11 of 2020 concerning Job Creation in order to encourage ease of doing business, a conducive investment climate, regional competitiveness, and wider job creation. Alignment with Law Number 11 of 2020 concerning Job Creation is carried out by granting authority to the Government to review Regional Tax rates in order to provide fiscal incentives to encourage investment development in the Regions. The Government can adjust Tax and Retribution rates with the determination of rates that apply nationally, as well as carry out supervision and evaluation of Regional Regulations concerning Taxes and Retributions that hinder the investment ecosystem and ease of doing business.

With the policies regulated in this Regional Regulation, it is expected that the public service can be more evenly distributed and with adequate quality. It is expected that the regulation of regional tax management will also provide the ability for regional governments to work together and synergistically with the government to achieve national development goals in encouraging increased public welfare and sustainable economic growth.

Reduction means that the tax debt, retribution, and/or sanctions that must still be paid by Taxpayers and/or Retribution Payers get lower.

For example, PT ABC has a regional tax debt worth IDR 30,600,000.00 consisting of a principal tax of IDR 30,000,000.00 and a tax administration sanction of IDR 600,000.00. PT ABC receives a reduction in all tax administration sanctions, so that the regional tax debt that must still be paid by PT ABC becomes only IDR 30,000,000.00.

Relief has the benefit of a lower tax base that is used as the basis for calculating the tax to be paid by the Taxpayers.

For example, PT ABC is subject to a type of regional tax with a Tax Base of IDR 300,000,000.00. Because PT ABC gets a 25% relief, the Tax Base for PT ABC is IDR 225,000,000.00 (IDR 300,000.000.00 x 75%)

Postponement means that the due date for payment of regional taxes and/or retributions owned by Taxpayers and/or Retributions is postponed.

For example, PT ABC, for a Tax Period is required to make a regional tax payment by March 15, 2024 at the latest. PT ABC submits a request for postponement of regional tax payments until April 10, 2024. If it is being considered for approval, PT ABC is permitted to pay regional taxes for the Tax Period mentioned until April 10, 2024.

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The postponement of tax and/or retribution payments does not immediately eliminate the sanctions for late tax payments on March 15, 2024.

Exemption means that Taxpayers and/or Retribution Payers are permitted to:

- i. not make regional tax payments;
- ii. not make regional tax payments and collections, and/or
- iii. not make certain regional retribution payments that are exempted

However, on the basis of the tax imposed on which the exemption is granted, Taxpayers are prohibited from collecting from Tax Subjects. For example, the turnover of PT ABC's business activities in a Tax Period is IDR 320,000,000.00 which consists of the following:

- IDR 300,000,000.00 is not exempted
- IDR 20,000,000.00 is exempted

On the turnover of IDR 320,000,000.00 above, PT ABC may only collect tax with a tax base of IDR 300,000,000.00
